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## Comparing Carnal Chads and Churchian Cucks

### Introduction

Over at Truth and Tolerance, D. P. Monahan wrote a post, [Godliness Is Not Attractive?](#) (2021/8/10), which addresses the fundamental disjunction between the modern Churchian approach to intersexual relationships and that of the Red Pill. Here, I'll respond to what he wrote and offer some of my own thoughts.

He writes,

*“Christian Red Pill bloggers like Aaron Renn [insist \(against the claims of Evangelical preachers\) that godliness does not attract women.](#) Women, instead, are attracted to power, what we call “alpha” attributes, i.e. size, strength, status, confidence, money. In fact, godliness is unattractive. Godliness is “beta”. Women will settle for “betas” because they are good providers, but will secretly despise them. Women pick alphas for sex and then settle for betas to take care of the alpha’s bastard kids. Therefore, men have to be taught not only how to be godly but also how to be alphas.”*

So if a man wants to compete in this SMP, then he has to display some Alpha characteristics, just to get on women’s radar. Here, I’ll remind the reader that this description fits the SMP of the post-sexual revolution, although this has started to shift into stalemate territory as of late. Before the sexual revolution, most men knew this and strove to hold their own. Fewer men had to make a concentrated effort to “become more Alpha”, largely because of the social pressure to marry and the prevalence of assortive mating.



*“I understand what they are getting at – we do observe these kinds of behavior and the examples he gives of what passes for Evangelical marriage advice are ridiculous – but I think the model for understanding the behavior is flawed. From a theological perspective it can’t be the way God intended human nature to work; since status is purely relative, by definition [not all men can be high-status](#). There will always be inequality of alpha traits. But since God wills that the great majority of men marry, it cannot be the case that God makes a condition for being married the display of these traits.”*

I agree that the model is flawed, but for a different reason. I am hesitant to believe that **God** requires men to become Alpha in order to marry (as is required by the secular SMP/MMP), but I do believe a man must show himself capable of managing his life well before he can receive further responsibilities and blessings (in the context of one’s relationship with God). I am also willing to concede that women require men to have certain Alpha traits before they will consider them as potential partners. Whether this is, in fact, the same thing remains a question of debate.

**Update:** Deep Strength has written a follow-up post, [No, godliness is still not attractive](#) (2023/4/21), in which he examines this disjoint. To summarize his essay, women are attracted to virtues related to Dominion, i.e. LAMPS, etc. (c.f. Genesis 1 and 2).

## Running Towards an Unknown Goal

Concerning the social order, Monahan wrote,

*“The alpha / beta dichotomy is basically a Nietzschean one in which the ubermensch takes what he wants while the ordinary people huddle in fear of social scorn. It is not a vision of an orderly society but of a fundamentally disordered one. It is also based on evolutionary psychology which tends towards just-so stories: an evolutionary explanation of how the alpha got his game is analogous to a wives’ tale of how the cat got his tale, tending towards tautology and generally free of evidence.”*

Personally, I regard evolutionary psychology to be a collection of interrelated theoretical models that attempt to explain the reality of human behavior, and rather well I might add. But Monahan is right that Western society is broken in this way, Nietzschean, as he put it.

But anyway, what kind of social order do we have?



More to the point, what is there for a man to assume Headship over?

In summary, we are currently presented with the following frameworks of options, discussed afterwards.

1. Churchianized Feminism – Complementarianism, “servant leaders”,
2. That which is touted by secular society – Promiscuity, serial monogamy, incelism, and so on.
3. Secular Red Pill – Polysexuality or MGTOW
4. Christian Red Pill – Extreme vetting with awareness or else celibacy
5. Covenant Relationships – Headship / Tingly Respect

The Secular Scene is decidedly pro-woman and anti-masculinity. Women are enabled to attain “independence” and gradually usurp dominance, which is an inversion of Headship. This is a no go.

The Churchian set up is not much different from the Secular one, except the Churchian view of intersexual relationships is an attempt to Christianize Feminism by imposing lofty ideals which apparently apply only to men. A cursory reading of Dalrock or Deep Strength makes this clear. Also a no go.

The Red Pill assessment is more true to reality, but still, it is only a praxeology of the current scene. Although this approach has the benefit of being practical and well informed, it fails to capture what God intends for us as Christian men, husbands, and fathers.


The Christian Red Pill is perhaps the best working model at present, but this only benefits a very small number of men.

Same thing goes for Headship / Covenant Relationships, which I'll guess are 1 in 10,000 or more.

Moreover, we don't have much of a working social order to begin with or even a working model that can be improved upon. From an optimistic view, this sets the stage for a new beginning.

## The Intersection of Virtue

D. P. Monahan identifies virtue as a trait which intersects with godliness and attraction.

*“Virtue understood as the perfection of a good potential is attractive because there is nothing else a person can possibly be attracted to except for virtue. Problems arise when a person is attracted to lesser virtues instead of higher, or is so enamored of one virtue that they ignore vices in other areas, something that happens all the time. This is probably not a simple matter of nature but also of social conditions: our society encourages young people to start fornicating in the second half of their teens and marry ten to fifteen years later, which means we are habituating them to judge members of the opposite sex and themselves in terms of what makes for a good fornicator and not a good spouse, hurting their marriage prospects later in life.”*

[Yes](#), virtue is an important part of attraction that correlates to godliness, but virtue alone isn't enough, especially in a culture that does not reward it.

As EOS [stated](#),

*“What keeps marriage together is a perfect storm of variables, in a dose / formula that is very hard to control for in the current environment. Two of those ingredients are virtue and attraction.”*

(More comments on this topic under the linked post.)

Here I'll point out something that is often overlooked in the discussion of the value of virtue — that **every virtue is coupled with a vice**. The virtues of Alpha males include social / sexual authority and the ability to generate raw attraction in females, while the vices of Alpha males are what perpetuate promiscuity and marital fraud. The virtues characteristic of Beta males is what maintains order in society while the Beta vices lead to social and sexual stagnation. It has often been said that what is needed is the perfect balance of Alpha and Beta traits.

Our concept of Godliness is too feminized, due to decades of Chivalry and the convergence of the church. As a result, the Beta set of virtues is held forth as the standard of godliness, in spite of its inherent vices, while the Alpha set of vices is branded “toxic masculinity”, and its virtues are either strongly admired or summarily ignored. This topic will continue to simmer on the backburner until we come up with a new paradigm of attraction and godliness in which Alpha virtues are recognized as masculine, and Beta vices are labeled weak.

## Identify That which is Lacking

Ever since the Manosphere pointed out that *"Chicks Dig Jerks"*, the Christian Manosphere has been amazed (and angered) by this fact. Has it never occurred to us that this reaction may arise from the envious voice of the inner simp within us? I say this because if we could take any Blue Pilled simp off the street and magically transform him into an Alpha, then he would quickly adapt to the polygynous, plate-spinning lifestyle of the Chad/PUA within a year, maybe even less — or worse, due to years of desperation and frustration.

In this respect, [Chads](#) stand a little closer to the Covenant ideal of masculinity, although they lack certain traits which are the vices of the archetype — submission to the Lord, purpose, self-control, and empathy.

Likewise, all women have an inner [Becky](#), [Gabrielle](#), [Karen](#), [Katie](#), [Lorena](#), [Mikayla](#), Gretchen, [Stacy](#), [Tomi](#), and so on in theirs. Women are also differentiated by which traits they feed and allow to grow.

Seeing how we are living in a time when female agency is at a millennial low, and sexual degeneracy is at an all-time high, perhaps it is God's grace to women and society that we have more simps and fewer Chads who plunder their hearts.

My point here is that all men have an inner Chad within their hearts. All men have an inner Gimp, an inner Simp, and an inner Wimp. Men are differentiated by which traits they feed and allow to grow. Men are also differentiated by which traits they are lacking.

*I now rejoice in my sufferings for you, and fill up in my flesh what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ, for the sake of His body, which is the church...*

**Colossians 1:24 (NKJV)**

You breed what you feed.

The current cultural environ feeds the simp in men, and the hoe in women. The churchianized church-lite does likewise and then offers “forgiveness” to the women, and a “man up” lecture to the men.

Instead of teaching men to be Betas who need to “man up”, maybe it would be closer to the point to teach men to be Alphas who need to “tone it down”. In fact, the latter approach was common prior to WW2, back when Men were MEN.

Regardless of what the churchians, or the culture, or even our own experience might tell us, if any one of our various inner natures don't come out, it's only because we don't have the opportunity, or we don't give ourselves permission to let it out.

We need to accept the fact that we are all sinners, men and women alike. We have to come to the point where we admit that we don't or can't measure up, and that it is "okay" in the sense that we must accept it because that's just how it is. We cannot make ourselves any more or less sinful. We have to find some way to work within this paradox. It's also "okay" in the sense that we don't have to face eternal damnation because Christ redeemed us. But it's NOT "okay" to assume we have this priceless gift from God and then reject God's sovereignty over our lives.

The bottom line is that as things now stand, when we compare Carnal Chads to Churchian Cucks, the basic Chad most resembles Headship!

Therefore, instead of condemning Chads and Stacys (etc.) for their egregious sins, we might be better served by their examples to ask, "*In what ways are they conforming to the Covenant Archetype of masculinity/femininity (such that God would allow this)?*" Instead of riding hard on envy and questioning the sovereignty and grace of God by asking, "*Why does God forgive bad boys/slores?*", we might be better off to say, "*God is merciful! How can I receive God's grace for **my own** shortcomings?*"

**Note:** Some readers might presume that I am condoning promiscuity, but I am not. I am not saying that, "*Since God forgives the bad guys, then it's okay to be bad. After all, God will forgive.*" This is a very naïve and [antinomian](#) view of the gospel — one that fails to recognize one's own moral agency and need of salvation. To go so far as to say "*sin doesn't matter*" fails to recognize the beauty, power, and righteousness of Christ and His kingdom. We must not lose sight of Christ and the reason why He forgives — It is for our own redemption and sanctification.



## Exit Questions

Some questions arise from this, which I'll pose here.

1. What does Covenant Law mean to the reader?
2. What does Covenant Law mean in the context of romantic love and marriage?
3. Why would we not experience/feel/recognize Covenant Law as God's love?
4. Does this mean that husbands should *anticipate* wives to fail in exercising agency, and arrange reservations or make a Plan B in the event that she does?
5. If a wife is insufficiently mature enough to exercise moral agency, does this mean that husbands should employ prophecy (e.g. expounding on Biblical principles and how they are applied), and/or knowledge (e.g. Red Pill theory, "Married Game" techniques) to keep their wives in line and feeling loved? Is this what love would require in this case?
6. Should men who take the Red Pill feel sorry for their past Blue Pill selves? On one hand, true repentance is necessary, but on the other hand, excessive self-pity is not helpful for moving on.

The alpha side would mean cheat/leave/and enjoy the last few years I have in the sun as an eligible bachelor/single dad. The beta side would mean give in to shlt tests, “yes dear-ing” my way through a comatose form of a life, and immersing myself in my job and hobbies.

Just today, (literally right before I logged in here) I got a text that read:

*“It’s been too many days. So I hope you are planning on staying up late tonight”*

It had a little devil horn emoji for effect.

So I guess I am pulling the delicate alpha/beta dance off well enough, since I am a guy and all I really care about at this stage in my life is getting laid regularly. (Everything else is kind of on autopilot to be honest.) But the way I got here was exactly because of running the gauntlet you are writing about, which is not super elevating to the human condition. Most men have it within them to be acceptably attractive but don’t know how to. Appearance is the easy part for most, stay active and fit, dress well for your niche and have proper grooming. What is much, much harder is changing mindset and attitude.

But it's a sign of 1) how much we men truly respect our fellow working men and what they put up with to scratch out a livelihood, and 2) how fed up and disillusioned we white-collar Williams are with the daily grind, something we're trapped in and endure because we have families to support and obligations we've trapped ourselves into in order to give those families the lifestyles they've become accustomed to.\*

If Mike had hung up his pilot wings and donned a blue Walmart smock, Liz would be gone, as would any other modern wife of her socioeconomic station. (Yes, I'm making this a *statement of fact*, not an assumption. There are too many examples of this happening to be able to say that I'm wrong.) Modern UMC women in the West don't tolerate drops in status or their standards of living — especially when their husbands *willingly* take menial jobs that are "beneath" them. It's inexcusable enough if he were to be laid off and have no other options. But *willingly* exchanging a white collar job for a blue-collar one? That's even more intolerable than him committing adultery or physically abusing her. She's outta there.

(\* My late paternal grandmother used to tell me the story of how my grandfather lost his accounting job not long after the Stock Market Crash of '29 and the onset of the Great Depression. He wound up working as a timekeeper for one of the railroads, a MAJOR loss of both prestige and money, one that impacted his and Grandma's standard of living in a BIG way. He was lucky to be able to get even *that* job. It would be *almost a decade* before he could find another accounting job comparable to the one he originally had. Yet Grandma stayed by Grandfather's side for 56 years until his death. If she had been born 50 years later she'd probably have kicked him to the curb after about a year [maybe less] of him not being able to find a job comparable to the one he'd lost. Since we're about to enter economic conditions today that are going to make the Great Depression seem minor by comparison, men unfortunate enough

to be married who become unemployed had better prepare themselves for being single again. Their wives are almost certainly NOT of the same moral stock my grandmother's generation was.)

Are you speaking as a general principle, or as a mystical observation? If the former, then you are showcasing the limitations of logic. (The logic of faith is not constrained to whether God is real or not because it rests on the false assumption that God may not be real.) If the latter, then I agree with you. (The mental machinations of unbelievers do not appear to be very logical.)

I wrote “needs to be” because most Westerners, even professing Christians, don’t understand this. They think Christianity must necessarily be containable in [Aristotelian](#) syllogisms, as anything else is considered to be “illogical”, and therefore dismissed. From the previous link,

*“In epistemology, or the theory of knowledge, Aristotelianism includes a concentration on knowledge either accessible by natural means or accountable for by reason; an inductive, analytical empiricism, or stress on experience...”*

The reason westerners cannot even grasp this is because the whole Western philosophical tradition is essentially [Hellenistic](#), and has been since antiquity. But Faith is not Aristotelian, nor can God be confined to human logic, nor can Truth be limited to the rational understanding.

*“Everyone worships something, even Sam Harris types. And everyone’s logic is — by its very nature — subservient to their faith in the object of their worship.”*

I would edit this to say, “everyone’s **reasoning** is subservient to their **system of beliefs**.” Some people are not aware of what it is they worship. The logic doesn’t always add up, and most people are not concerned about the incongruencies between logic and reason anyway. Also, not everyone has faith.

*“Some people understand that and admit to it. The rest are fools.”*

Fools, according to a Biblical understanding, are those who lack spiritual discernment (the eyes of faith) and instead rely on their emotions and/or reasoning (logical or not).

**Romans 1:21-23 (NASB)**

21 For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, but they became futile in their reasonings, and their senseless hearts were darkened. 22 Claiming to be wise, they became fools, 23 and they exchanged the glory of the incorruptible God for an image in the form of corruptible mankind, of birds, four-footed animals, and crawling creatures.

We could add “of hot, sexy women” after “corruptible mankind”. (Read [Romans 1:16-32](#) for the full context.)

Fools are those who do not recognize God.\* It is not whether they understand what they believe and can make rational sense of it. Many Christians don't really understand their own faith, and yet they are not necessarily fools.

*\*Recognizing God is a living faith. It is not giving mental assent to a set of propositions about theology. That is Aristotelianism / Hellenism.*
